## From the Pastor's Study

Friends in Christ,

We have been together for seven months now and, let's be honest, things are weird. Normally, with this new year in full swing we would begin to look at the future, to dream a little and talk about how we would better follow Christ's command to be church. We would be asking folks how our little congregation could better feed the hungry, clothe the naked, remember the prisoner, and house the homeless. Those questions matter, they truly do. But this year is weird.

Covid has given us a unique way to look outside ourselves and our church building to our neighborhood. Through our streaming and parking lot worship we are reaching folks who would not likely darken our doorstep. We are providing a way for the homebound to participate in service. We are giving to our community in new and unique ways, though not necessarily mentioning the above commands. But why do we go to church anyway?

A few years ago, Pew research conducted a study of 4729 Americans asking why people go (and don't go) to church. Here are their answers:

**First, here are the top 10 reasons given by Americans who attend religious services at least once a month,** according to Pew. Survey respondents were allowed to give more than one reason. The percentage refers to people who said this was a "very important" reason for their decision:

- 1) To become closer to God. (81%)
- 2) So their children will have a moral foundation. (69%)
- 3) To become a better person. (68%)
- 4) For comfort in times of trouble or sorrow. (66%)
- 5) They find the sermons valuable. (59%)
- 6) To be part of a faith community. (57%)
- 7) To continue their family's religious traditions. (37%)
- 8) They feel obligated to go. (31%)
- 9) To meet new people or socialize. (19%)
- 10) To please their family, spouse, or partner. (16%)

**And here are the reasons folks don't go to church:**

- 1) They practice their faith in "other ways." (37%)
- 2) They are not believers. (28%)
- 3) No reason is "very important." (26%)
- 4) They haven't found a house of worship they like. (23%)
- 5) They don't like the sermons. (18%)
- 6) They don't feel welcome. (14%)
- 7) They don't have the time. (12%)
- 8) Poor health or mobility. (9%)
- 9) No house of worship in their area. (7%)

## So, plain and simple... Why are you here? Why are you a part of the church? Why this congregation?

This is a healthy conversation to have, with yourself, with your family, with your pastor. Getting at the “why” is something we often ask our children to do. Why do you feel that way? Why are you getting good (or bad) grades? Why are you growing up so fast? Often, we forget that “why” matters as we grow older. So, why are you coming (or not) to church? What is your reason, and does it align with this survey?

As you may recall, Lent starts on February 17<sup>th</sup>. I invite you to have the conversation above and then write your “Why?” on a ribbon. We will tie these ribbons to the cross in the sanctuary (and parking lot) and use Lent this year as a time of meditation on “why” we are at church. Also, please see the “Lenten Calendar” for daily meditations on Lent below.

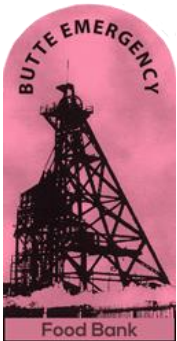

### **Gold Hill Lutheran Church Council**

#### **Minutes - January 12, 2021**



**This virtual zoom meeting was opened by Mike Lawson at 6:15 p.m.** The following were present: Mike Lawson, President; Curt

Quist, Administration Director; Revonda Stordahl, Treasurer; Peggy Graving, Secretary; Chris Ketchum, Worship Ministry; Lynn Aniksdal, Leadership Ministry; and Pastor Marlow Carrels. Julie Corbin, Spiritual Ministry, logged on later.

Pastor Carrels read from the Book of Concord, the Lutheran Confessions for our devotions. He read Article 16 of the Augsburg Confession stating the church’s perspective on recognition of those who are involved in politics. Secular institutions are ordained by God. The ELCA and other church bodies are asking for President Trump to step down. All government is ordained by God. We are grounded in our confession. We follow the rule of law and “call out” those who have committed crimes.

This devotion came following the attack on the Capitol in Washington D.C. by those who follow President Trump and his unsubstantiated statements regarding the election of President Biden.

A motion was made by Revonda and seconded by Chris to accept the minutes of the December meeting as printed and emailed.

**Revonda went through the financial report** and said that she would be making some changes after speaking with Bruce Graving regarding not having the loan as a receipt but setting up a separate line item (receipts accountable) for the loan and the repayment of the loan. We had a good December, but still ended up with a deficit. Revonda noted the fact that since we are not having the annual meeting in January, the salaries for the staff and Pastor are unchanged unless we begin paying them the salary stated on the proposed budget retroactive back to January 1<sup>st</sup>. She asked if we could go ahead without the approval of the congregation to pay the proposed salaries. After discussion it was unanimously agreed upon that the salaries can be paid using the proposed budget with a signed document from Pastor and Mary stated they understand the money would need to be returned if the budget was not approved by the congregation. Pastor asked a question that the nominating committee had asked. How much would Mark Rule’s office charge to do the complete financials of the church including the reports? If we could afford this, the Treasurer would become more a figurehead overseeing the reports and being the liaison with Mark Rule and the council. Revonda stated that all reports are in Quicken and easily accessed. She said Mary enters and writes all checks and Revonda checks to be sure they are in the correct places in the budget, if not makes the adjustments necessary and prints the reports. After discussion it was decided that this change to Mark Rule, if decided upon after study, could not take place because it would have to be approved by the congregation. We would study it during the next year.

**Pastor’s Report** is attached in the office. He noted that the three funerals are not for members of the church but veterans who have passed away in our community. We had received an email from Dale stating that he and Dorothy are moving to Glasgow, so we are short pianists for our services. Sue Repola has also resigned. Pastor will be answering emergency calls from Gloria Dei members while Pastor Sara is gone as noted in his report. Pastor has been meeting with the Godtland family and they are planning a church service on a Friday in June followed by a community service on Saturday at the Mother Lode. He has been in touch with Peggy Probasco regarding the loss of her Mother, Dorleen.

Mike reported that he was interviewed for KXLF about Pete and his influence in our church and the community. Curt reported that he and Peggy Graving made eleven Christmas bags for children in our congregation in December and delivered them. They are also sending cards for birthdays, wedding anniversaries, and baptismal anniversaries to members each month.

**Chris reviewed her report** (attached in office). Her committee has come up with a plan for Ash Wednesday service using Q-tips. The Lenten color is purple for the altar. Dave wants to record music for Easter and is working on this. They will continue to discuss Holy Week. Chris and her committee were thanked for the success of the Christmas Eve Service.

Dale had sent in an email regarding moving to Glasgow to take care of Dorothy's Mom. He included in his email a resignation from the council. He hopes for the time being to keep the web site up to date as we look for someone else to take it over.

Lynn was on the call, but we could not see her or hear her. She could hear us. She wanted us to know that everything has been taken care of with the company that plows the parking lot and Kevin Huff. She also has seven individuals who are shoveling the sidewalks using a weekly rotation.

Julie had no report but did tell us that she is no longer taking classes and would like the names of those we delivered bags to at Christmas so she can keep in touch with them.

**New Business:** Pastor reported that he has four individuals who would like to anonymously donate money up to a certain amount for additional tech equipment to be able to continue streaming our services even after we are back in the church. He says it would take a lap top computer, wired internet to the balcony in the sanctuary, and additional cards for recording. He has talked to the synod and there is an individual, Colter, who is willing to help us get it going. We do not have enough megabytes to handle this with our current carrier – Century Link. Pastor has checked with Spectrum and says we could get the megabytes we need at a lower cost. He will continue looking. He also said he would like to train individuals who could do the website and help with the recording of the services. He will get the word out. Julie moved; Curt seconded the motion to have Pastor continue working on this. The motion carried. Peggy commented that she did not want Pastor spending his time on this, but that we needed to find someone in the congregation to do this work.

**Old Business:** We will wait to plan a retreat for the new council until we have dates for the annual meeting. We are hoping that we will be able to have the annual

meeting in June. The nominating committee has talked to two individuals regarding vacancies on the council and have not heard back. Pastor will let them know that Dale's spot on the council is also in need of being filled. The nominating committee will be asking individuals to attend the synod convention virtually in June. Mike and Peggy said they would be willing if asked by the nominating committee.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
