Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2 NRSV)

Since the global pandemic was declared in March 2020, many of us have endured extended emotional and psychological anguish. That experience may be dramatically worsened by the ugly realities of racism, sexism, homophobia, xenophobia, or poverty. Our anguish has taken the form of sadness in isolation, anxiety in uncertainty, grief over loss, stress over economic challenges and worry over events beyond our control — including the tremendous impact of the crisis on our children. This pandemic threatens our mental health just as much as our physical health. For millions of us adults living in the United States, receiving the vaccine and the hope it brings has alleviated our unease, sorrow, and grief.

This past year has provided some of us with a deeper understanding of and empathy for the ongoing mental health challenges endured by our neighbors, friends, and family. Our church intentionally recognizes the anguish our siblings in Christ experience daily — pandemic or no — and the fear many of them feel about sharing their stories.

As a church we also acknowledge the true depths of these invisible illnesses. Our children, neighbors, and friends grappling with mental health issues need to know that God does not love them any less. They need to hear that they, too, are embraced by God's unfathomable love.

Our church cautions against judgmental words and actions that might suggest to someone that their faith is not strong enough or that their outlook on life would improve if they would change certain behaviors. Praying, socializing, and exercising are great activities that can help someone get out of a slump or move past a painful episode. But this is not always the solution for moderate or severe depression, bipolar depression, anxiety, or even grief. Telling someone they aren't doing enough to be happy creates a sense of stigma that they are not living "correctly." We need to listen so that our words of care and compassion guide others to the help they need. We need to support people in their struggles, walking side by side in partnership with them through the good days and the bad.

Dear church, God loves us all. No matter how we are grappling, we are not alone; God is with us. We must seek ways to erase the stigma surrounding mental illness and continually love everyone compassionately as a child of God. We must embrace the benefits of therapy and encourage the use of medication when necessary in supporting and sustaining mental health and wellness. We must also work to ensure access to affordable mental health care for all people, especially those living in poverty or in historically marginalized communities.

Our faith teaches that caring for health is a shared endeavor. Being the body of Christ means carrying one another's burdens; it also means placing our burdens in God's hands and admitting to a caring person close to us that we need help. This is true no matter how great or small our anguish may be.

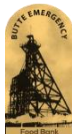

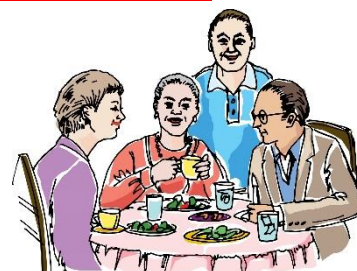

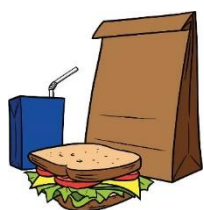

Notes from the Trust

In this article we are going to explain how the trust operates.

The trust fund has two parts. In the perpetual fund the principal is never used but its income is issued.

Currently we are managing three perpetual funds, they are as follows:

- Jennie and George Schotte Scholarship Fund
- DeWitt Bible Fund & Theological Fund
- Graving Fund

There is a Memorial Fund, in which both the principal and the income can be used for church functions. In the past we have used this money to support church ministries such as for the quilters in our congregation, music for worship, and many others. The money was also used to purchase Christ Candles and sewing machines for the church.

The trust committee is made up of five members of Gold Hill Lutheran Church to manage the funds of the trust. Each member of the trust is elected by the congregation for a period of 5 years that is staggered to keep continuity for the management of the trust.

Ron Gruss called the meeting to order. Mike Lawson led us in an opening prayer.



Old Business

- We haven't had any scholarship applications so far.
- No bibles have been ordered because of the disruptions from the church fire. The bibles will be ordered from Augsburg as part of a larger order to get a good deal after the fire disaster.
- Ed gave the financial report. Vern(m) and Annette(s) to accept the report with the correction of a date under the Loan Payment Transactions section. The report was accepted as corrected.

New Business

- A request was received to put the Trust Treasurer's report into the monthly Nugget. Vern(m) and Mike Welker(s) to put the treasurer's report into the Nugget. The motion passed.
- Also, Ron will be writing an article each month in the Nugget about the Trust Committee.
- Mike Lawson read a letter he received from Bruce Graving on 8/4/2021 concerning 1) how the trust income could be used to further the objectives of the Trust Resolution and 2) how best to perform the support functions of the Trust, i.e., investment management and accounting.
- Pastor Marlow said we should ask "Is our money doing the work of God?" He also said the ELCA recommends that any financial expert shouldn't be someone from our congregation. And he recommended that we need a gift policy established.
- Vern pointed out that we did have a presentation from Edward Jones and have requested presentations from other organizations but have so far failed to arrange any other meetings.
- At the next meeting the committee will discuss and review the Trust Resolution.
- The next meeting will be Thursday 8/26/2021 at 7pm at Mike Welker's office.

The meeting was adjourned.

**Council Meeting Minutes –
Gold Hill Lutheran Church
Tuesday, August 10, 2021
6:00 PM New Deal Community Center**

The meeting was called to order at 6:20 pm. Roll call taken and all present except Mike L, Lynn A. and Nicholas C. Peggy asked Chris to assist in taking the minutes as she was attending via zoom and was having trouble hearing everyone's reports. His (Pastor Carrels) devotional discussion was the principles of Baptism. He reviewed the affirmation we say at Baptism emphasizing that this is a promise to God: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper. To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. His report extended from 6/9/21 to 8/10/21. The minutes from June 8th were reviewed and the following corrections were made - Pastor Judith Lamb of Anaconda as her full name because her last name was omitted. Ken is the spokesperson from Dayspring Restoration instead of Kim as stated in the report. Danette Fitzpatrick moved to accept minutes as corrected, seconded by Pat G. and the motion passed. Danette F. gave her Treasurer's report. Peggy G. moved and it was seconded to accept the report as submitted. The motion passed. Danette was asked to look through the reports and find one that better shows the profit and loss for the month. Pastor Carrels reported he took two weeks of Paternity leave in June to July 2021. His attached report (*see page 8*) was reviewed. He shared that the Southwest Montana Veterans home is looking for people to visit the Veterans and their clergy would like people to give communion at the Veterans Home. He shared that the Montana Chemical Dependency Center in Butte is asking for help in providing religious services on site. He stated this would be a Bible study with Communion and will ask the congregation if they would like to be involved in either of these requests. He will check if



there are any requirements before entrance into the MCDC facility. Pastor Carrels was offered free office space at Oro Fino on Tuesday from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm to use as office hours. This will be published for the congregation.

Curt Q. gave an updated report from Dayspring Restoration. They are focused on the Fellowship Hall being completed so we can move indoors as soon as possible. He said he will ask them to push forward on the completion of the Fellowship Hall and kitchen before the fall weather begins to cool. He said he will bring his questions of "Where do we want our Church to be?" to the next council meeting when there will be more in attendance.

Chris K. discussed having Church this Sunday 8/15/21 at 10:00 AM at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church with a picnic after at Stodden Park. Pat G. moved and Danette seconded that we attend their Church per their invitation. The motion was passed. Chris asked the council if we could consider using a temporary altar in the Fellowship Hall when we return indoors because Dayspring will move the altar in the sanctuary only once. We would have to move it back to the sanctuary and it is large and heavy. Pastor Carrels suggested we use the stone altar if Mike Vincent thinks it can be moved easily. Dave Stordahl has offered a wooden piece to use temporarily as well. A final decision will be made after someone has visited with Mike Vincent. Sunday, September 5th, will be designated as our Sunday to bring baked bread for the coffee hour with butter, honey, jams, and jellies. This will be the end of the Bread of Life sermons for the summer. We will ask the congregation to bring homemade or purchased bread and jams for all to enjoy. These will signify the fruits and grains of summer. We will also have a hymn sing on that Sunday. Gold Hill Choir will begin practice on September 1st at 6:00 pm at Gloria Dei in their Fellowship Hall. (*See report on page 9*).

Pat G. reported that the Vacation Bible School was enjoyed by all who attended. The theme was Affirmation, and she said the children were involved and had fun. The Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp Counselors helped with the event. Sunday School

begins on September 12th, which is also God's Work Our Hands Sunday. She said that the Sunday School children will help with the projects that we plan to do on that Sunday. Pastor's message for each Sunday will be the same message used for the Sunday School lessons.

New Business: We discussed a joint worship service on Sunday September 19th at Clark Park with Christ Anglican, Aldersgate Methodist, Gold Hill, and Gloria Dei Churches. Chris K. moved, Pat G. seconded that we have this unified worship service and the motion passed. Pastor Carrels reported that he was asked to give the sermon that Sunday. God's Work Our Hands is September 12th. Pastor will reach out to Nicholas and ask him to plan the events for that Sunday.

Old Business: Pastor reported that he is printing the bulletins each week for church. We reminded him to submit his expenses. We decided that at this time it is easier to continue in this manner than to purchase our new equipment or hire the printing done. Once we are back in the church, we will resume the normal printing by Mary. Danette discussed meeting at the bank to transfer signatures for the checking account. She reported a Federal Tax form was corrected and the error was related to a misprint of a number on the account by Mark Rule and Company.

Danette F. moved that we adjourn the meeting. It was seconded by Pat G. and the motion passed. We adjourned at 7:15 pm with the Lord's Prayer.

Worship and Music Report to Council August 2021

Lector and Usher List completed for August 2021

Gloria Dei has invited us to Worship at their Church on August 15, 2021. We have announced this invitation at our Sunday service 8/1/21. We are awaiting approval of Counsel to report to the Congregation.

The Church colors are green for August.

We acknowledge that moving the Altar in our sanctuary is a cumbersome undertaking. We know that if we have Dayspring move it into the Fellowship Hall for Worship service, then in the future, we will have to move it back into the Sanctuary. This is a difficult task and expectation because of its size and weight. Dayspring has agreed to move it once, in other words, one way. Our committee has discussed the possibility of having a wooden Altar made – simple and temporary, to use for the reasonable time that we must wait before moving back into the Sanctuary. Another consideration is to move the stone Altar already in place outside into the Fellowship Hall when it is reopened. We are asking the Council to seriously consider these suggestions as resolve to moving the large and heavy Altar. We have skilled people in the congregation who could design and build a suitable piece to use temporarily as an Altar and could be easily dismantled. Both a wooden or stone Altar could be moved much easier than our original Altar.

The Hymns have been selected for August and September. There will be a Hymn sing on Sunday, September 5, 2021, during Worship service.

Since August Bible stories speak about being “fed by God” we discussed asking members to make different breads to serve at coffee hour with butter, honey, jams, and jellies on August 29, 2021, the last Sunday in August.

Dave Coleman will be announcing this Sunday, the beginning of Choir on Wednesday, September 1, 2021, 6:00 PM at the Gloria Dei Fellowship Hall. We have asked and been given approval to practice there until Gold Hill Church is reopened for use. We will be contacting members to gather together a willing and joyful Gold Hill Choir!

We are asking Council to approve that our Worship and Music Committee be part of the decision making in regard to ordering Hymnals, Paraments, Candles, and Baptismal Font. The Music Director has important input that is needed to make wise decisions about music selection. He is abreast of the CCLI regulations we must follow. The Altar supplies have been selected by Worship and Music committee members for a significant time at Gold Hill in the past. We know the needs of the Church related to worship and have access to the catalog and ordering.

The meeting was closed with Prayer. The next Worship and Music Meeting will be September 7, 2021, at Emma Park.
