## A Message from ELCA Presiding Bishop Eaton

Dear sibling in Christ,

At the beginning of the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to John, Jesus is presented with a dilemma. After healing numerous people, he's amassed a large following, and they're hungry. He asks his disciple Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?"

Philip tells Jesus they don't have enough cash to feed the crowd. The need is too great, he says.

Here the Gospel writer makes clear that Jesus is testing his disciples. When another, Andrew, points to a boy with five barley loaves and two fish, provisions that Andrew doubts will satisfy the hungry crowd, Jesus simply replies, "Make the people sit down."

I imagine Jesus chuckles, even shaking his head. What he does next defies all reason. Jesus takes the boy's food, thanks God for it and uses it to feed the 5,000 gathered — with leftovers to boot!

As we consider the last year and our current reality navigating the COVID-19 pandemic, we in the church might be tempted to view our situation as Philip or Andrew might. We could wring our hands and say we're low on funds or look at our resources and complain they're not enough.

Yet, looking at the stories that came out of 2020, I see evidence of God's miracles. You'll see too when you flip through the pages of this year's "Stories of Faith in Action" ...

We showed up as church together to provide hope and healing to hungry souls. Thank you!

The disciples in John's Gospel approach ministry challenges with a scarcity mindset. Jesus shows us a different way: trusting in God's awesome abundance.

We joined with the Task Force to discuss the floor plan for refurnishing the Sanctuary when it is completed. This will be an ongoing conversation with the Congregation and Committees. The Gold Hill Council agreed to try some of the ideas that were discussed. The idea of having worship with Pastor Carrels preaching from the center of the Fellowship Hall will be implemented on a trial basis. We will realign the seating to allow the congregation the experience of facing the center where the Altar will be placed.

## **Notes from the Trust**

The Trust Committee has been deliberating frequently these past few months. The Trust Committee's intent is to have a clearer purpose of the trust. Our last meeting was on September the 30th.

After discussion, the Trust Committee has decided to combine the perpetual and memorial funds into one checking account but will keep the accounts separate on a monthly basis with a spreadsheet for transparency. The committee vetted many high yield checking accounts and found that most online financial institutions only offer these accounts for personal use. We then found the ELCA Mission Investments checking account. This account APY is .5%, which is greater interest than the current bank we are using now. If you wish to learn more about Mission Investments, please visit their website at <a href="https://www.mif.elca.org">www.mif.elca.org</a>.

The Trust Committee voted back in 2019, prior to COVID, to look into outside entities to manage the monies of the trust. After considerable research, the Trust Committee decided to work with ELCA Mission Investments. Due to the uncertainty of the pandemic, the Trust Committee decided to hold off moving forward at that time until certain unknowns of the pandemic were answered. On September 30th, the Trust decided to move forward with transferring of CD's and Funds to the Investment group along with setting up a checking account through the ELCA. With continuing communication with the Trust Committee and the congregation, the Committee

believes that goals can be achieved to do God's will. Important things are to come with clear objectives and great intentions.

Members present: Ron Gruss, Mike Welker, Ed Engle, Annette Lawson, and Vern Nielsen Ron Gruss called the meeting to order. Mike(m) and Ed(s) to accept the minutes of the last meeting. The minutes were accepted.

#### **Old Business**

Annette did research on the bonding of committee members with check signing authority.
 According to the Trust Resolution, the bonding is at the discretion of the Trust Committee. Mike (m) and Annette(s) to set the bond at \$0 until a possible later date. The motion passed.

Discussion was held about combining the perpetual and memorial checking accounts into one checking account. Vern(m) and Annette(s) to consolidate the accounts into one checking account and to keep them separate on a spreadsheet. The motion passed.

#### **New Business**

- Discussion on gift policies was tabled since the creation of a gift policy needs to be set up by the congregation at the next annual meeting, not by the Trust Committee. The Trust committee can be a source of information and make recommendations. The rules for managing the perpetual funds will depend on the creation of a gift policy.
- The committee decided to go forward with the creation of an endowment with ELCA Mission Investment Funds. This was already voted on in 2019, but action on it was delayed because of the unsure status of the Trust Committee itself and because of the meeting restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic. We will now transfer CD's and Thrivent funds to the ELCA Mission Investment Fund and establish a checking account with them. Anyone wanting more information can go to their website mif.elca.org.
- Mike(m) and Ed(s) to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
- The next meeting will be Thursday 11/11/2021 at 7pm.

#### Decisions made by The Gold Hill Church Fire Task Force

7/7/21 No wood paneling will be used in wall reconstruction of the church, only sheetrock.

The east wall of the Fellowship Hall will be sheet rocked from floor to ceiling with no window openings. The wall between the Library and Fireside will be removed, the wood ceiling and beam in the Library exposed, the two storage rooms retained, combined room to be carpeted, fireplace to remain, no floor

covering in storage rooms.

Wall between 201 and 203 removed to create new choir room, carpeted, raised area to remain.

Closets in audio/visual to remain, shelving removed.

7/27/21 Coffee station in NE corner of Fellowship Hall removed.

The handicap restroom remodeled to include an ADA (unisex) shower, existing flooring remains, sheetrock the ceiling.

Women's restroom remains unchanged.

Men's restroom to receive new sheet vinyl flooring.

Remove walls between 202 and 204; 208 and 210. LVP flooring in both new rooms, new audio/video room (old choir room) and room 206. All ceilings painted white to be repainted ceiling white.

First floor hallways LVP, second floor hallway use existing floor. NOTE: There was originally carpet on the first-floor hallway ramp leading up to the Sanctuary and I believe the general consensus is to use carpet there again instead of LVP for obvious reasons.

LED lighting to be used throughout the project.

7/28/21 Dave Coleman steps down from the Task Force.

7/29/21 Planters in the hallway eliminated

9/9/21 Wood ceiling in Fellowship Hall to remain (seal coated).

Color #226B (yellow) chosen for all four walls of the Fellowship Hall. Color #423A (Chino's) chosen for all remaining walls in the church wing on first and second floors, Fireside room, and kitchen. Sanctuary and basement excluded.

9/16/21 Brick in the hallway ramp (first floor) to remain unpainted.

9/19/21 Flooring chosen for first and second floor of the wing and the Fireside room.

Sheet vinyl- Armstrong Pacific Mat Granite #AR887016. LVP – Builder's choice #1430 WG Rig Oak. Carpet – Mid Century Mad Satellite 00520, carpet squares. NOTE: The stairwell will be done in broadloom with pad in a style matching the Satellite 00520.

9/30/21 The color Extra White chosen for all doors and trim on first and second floor of the church wing, Fireside Room and Kitchen.

10/10/21 The Task Force unanimously accepted a new floor plan for the Sanctuary based on a slightly adjusted version of "God At The Center Of Our Worship" from Pastor Carrel's power point presentation "A Time To Dream Together." The Task Force recommended this floorplan be presented to the Church Council for further explanation, discussion, and acceptance. Members of the Worship committee were also in attendance at this meeting and agreed the concept should move forward.

#### Upcoming decisions.

Flooring decisions (carpet or LVP) for Mary's office, room 104, Pastor's office.

Carpet or LVP on the hallway ramp to the Sanctuary. It used to be carpet.

Paint color for basement (white?) and the Sanctuary.

Do we build the ramp into the Chancel as proposed? Along the north wall, cut into the floor of the Chancel.

Do we update the step in the Sanctuary from 10.5 inches wide to 18 inches wide.

Flooring style and color for the basement and Sanctuary.

# Council Meeting Minutes – Gold Hill Lutheran Church Tuesday, October 12, 2021

Meeting was called to order by Council President Mike Lawson at 6:03 p.m.



Roll call was taken: Lynn, Mike, Curt, Pat, Danette, Nicholas,

Pastor, and Peggy, who joined via zoom and phone. Chris had a vet emergency and arrived late.

Pastor's devotions were from Numbers Chapter 33. In Numbers they keep close track of all matters, and this is important. Think about where we have been and where we are going. Prayer given.

Minutes of the September Council Meeting had been read by all. A motion was made by Lynn to accept the minutes and seconded by Curt; the motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:** Danette did not have the information and it was given by Curt. September financial picture was worse than August, there was a \$2500.00 donation to the church that really helped. Expenses were \$13,000 and the monthly income was \$11,000. Curt made a motion to accept treasurer's report. Pat seconded the motion and it carried. Our attendance since we moved into the fellowship hall averages about forty.

Pastor presented the assembly format of worshipping for our sanctuary. [See Pastor's Report pp. 10-15.] We can start practicing this in the fellowship hall now. Motion made by Curt and seconded by Nicholas to try out this new format. Motion carried. President's Report: Mike passed out a handout on his report explaining he went back and checked to see if permits were needed. They are not for the fencing of our property. Mike has marked off our property lines and put some orange candlestick posts so they can be seen. Mike said he tries to stop at the church work site daily when in town. Dayspring reported that it is difficult to get help.

**Administrator's Report:** Curt gave an updated Dayspring Report – Some heating coils have been soldered and there are twelve-foot sections ready instead of just 4- or 6-foot sections. He shared the Task

Force report written by Rande. Curt has not had time to contact the URA regarding funds for the church.

Chris's Worship Committee Report: Chris has ordered some more disposable communion cups. She highlighted her attached report. She said she has been made aware of how important it is to count how many are in church each Sunday.

She reported that Peggy Graving is making red paraments for Reformation Sunday and Miriam Haley is making white paraments for All Saints Sunday. Pastor told Worship Committee they can come in on Saturday at 1 p.m. to set up the Fellowship Hall for worship on Sunday. Chris also talked about Advent Season and how we don't know what we have or will have after we get everything back from storage, so they are approaching it as if they have nothing. The worship committee met with the task force and discussed the new worship format.

Lynn's Property Report: The sprinklers were blown out at the church and parsonage on 9/22/21. The abatement program will be on hold until spring. Lynn is going to start compiling a shoveling schedule soon. She will post a message in the Nugget for volunteers to clean the church since we have no janitorial services.

**Pat's Educational Report:** Pat asked us all to make sure we use the e-mail address <a href="mailto:rongruss2@msn.com">rongruss2@msn.com</a> to contact her. She said she is getting about two attendees for Sunday School weekly.

Nicholas's Outreach Report: Nicholas would like us to begin using Google for non-profits instead of the Montana Standard. He had handouts for everyone to look over. He feels that we would reach more individuals. He was asked to see if he could get someone in the congregation who is technology savvy to help us get started. Anything to be posted must be presented to the council for approval prior to posting.

#### **New Business:**

There was discussion regarding using the Montana Standard for advertising. Discussion was around using the internet for our advertising, using the newspaper with the number of older members we have, and using both formats for now. Curt made a motion to continue the advertising in the Standard for the year at a cost of

\$572.00. Pat seconded the motion and the motion carried. There were three opposing votes.

Pastor read a letter from Dave Coleman about how frustrated he is with the COVID and choir situation.

Discussion was held and we felt that better communication was needed with Dave. Curt was going to follow up with Dave.

#### **Old Business:**

The bids for the video and audio were too high for our current budget. Pastor had read about some basic PA kits that are available for churches. He is going to do some further research.

The bid for the security system also was very high. We have decided to check the system that is in place and install the cameras and smoke alarms that were provided. Some of these materials were provided by Nicholas.

Discussion was held regarding joint council meetings two times per year with Gloria Dei in February and August. To better accomplish some goals at these meetings it was suggested we set up an agenda to follow and the counterparts of each office from each church visit. Curt made a motion that was seconded by Peggy that the presidents first meet to see if Gloria Dei would be interested.

There was a fundraiser for FLBC brought up but tabled for another time.

Curt asked us to continue to pray for the person whose name was on the envelope we drew at the last meeting. He stressed spending time in thought and prayer for each other on the council. We need to have TRUST. We need to have higher intentions. We need to know each is reliable, dependable.

The meeting was adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.






- · The next slide is our old church layout with no measurements.
- The pews are APPROXIMATELY 12' x 2'. We had approximately 13" of space between each pew on the north side!!! And about 18" of space on the south side... The norm is about 36"!!! This might be why we were so cramped...
- · Grand total we had 17 pews on the main floor




- The next slides are what the church might look like if we use what we have to create a new, more open space with ramps...
- You'll notice I DID NOT put the organ back, this is because we need to have a discussion as to whether or not we want to keep the organ. It was top of the line technology when it was made in the '70s or '80s, but there are other, smaller options that do not require the speaker arrangement it currently has... Also, it may have been damaged by the smoke, but we will not know until we use it again... So, do we want to "take the risk" or not? What are your thoughts?





- So, as you can see, in order to better facilitate movement in the sanctuary we might need to limit our seating from the 102 on the floor to 72 ish... There are multitudes of ways to do that... So...
- Finally, I want to draw your attention to this information that was put out to us by the Rev. Dr. Melina Quivick, a former member of Gold Hill


In short, Dr. Quivick's work is meant to show that God is in the midst of the congregation rather than "up there away from me". Further, God is shown, by the movement of the altar, to be in the congregation, with us at all times, rather than somewhere far away, hidden or guarded by the chancel, the pastor, and the communion rail.







Below is the proposal from the Task Force, this should not cost a penny (except the ramp), but it would be a way for us to live into a new paradigm of church. Further, this layout shows us seating for 100 people one the main floor only!!! We have not even accounted for the crying room or the balcony. We used to max out at 108 people in the sanctuary without extra seats. This would bring us closer to 130 with plenty of room for sleeps.
